Men's Fellowship

HAPPY 10th YEAR ANNIVERSARY to the Men's group! November of this year marked 10 years of uninterrupted fellowship and prayer for Rev. John Orlando and the Men's Group. It started with Rev. Orlando and Brother Hector Ferrer as the leaders. After two years, Brother Hector moved on and was replaced by Sam Rivera. The two of them led the men for an additional eight years with a deep passion for the Lord and a desire to see men walk in their true callings.

Soon other Men's Groups began to erupt not only at Calvary, but also in other churches. The ultimate goal is to have regular Friday meetings throughout the month so that a man will always have a place to go, according to Brother John Orlando.

This group has encouraged some men to walk in their true calling, and start ministries. Others have experienced miracles and transformations such as physical and emotional healings; and still others were set free from drugs, alcohol, pornography, lust, and smoking... etc. In addition, many marriage relationships were restored.

We asked Rev. Orlando some questions and these are some of his responses:

Q: What are the circumstances that led you to start a men's fellowship?

A: **It was prophesied over my life by a woman at Calvary. She told me that God was going to use me to raise up men that would raise up other men, and those men would raise up men. The leaders of the church and the community would call upon me for assistance and that thousands upon thousands** (cont'd)

A Friend of Sinners

"Then Jesus said to his host, "When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or sisters, your relatives, or your rich neighbors; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous" (Luke 14:12-14).

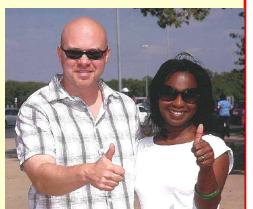
According to Luke's Gospel, Jesus' primary mission was "to seek and save the lost" (19:10). Reaching the lost was so much a part of His mission that the religious community often accused Him of being friends with sinners, "Here is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners" (Mat. 11:19). It is Biblical to make friends with the lost for the right reasons. Our motives, however, should be the same as Jesus', 'to seek and save the lost.'

On one occasion, when the Pharisees questioned Jesus about fellowshiping with tax collectors and sinners, He responded, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance" (Luke 5:30-32).

In the same spirit, and especially during this time of celebration, let us remember to invite the 'tax collectors' and 'sinners' in our lives to our banquets. You can start today by prayerfully and purposely asking someone who does not yet know the Lord to come to your Small Group and to Calvary Temple. Like Jesus, don't be concerned about being labeled, 'a friend of sinners.' Just know that your 'friendship' can make the difference between Heaven or Hell for someone!

Q: You could have started any kind of group, but you started a men's group. Beside the fact that you are a man yourself, why a MEN'S GROUP?

A: I have a heart for men and I want to see the church change back to a place were the Men are the prayer warriors and the leaders they need to be in their Home, Community, Work Place, and Church!

Q: What do you believe your burden is for men?

A: Because I know what the TRUE POTENTIAL is for their lives, and I hate to see it slip away.

Q: What do you know to be the problems with men today, whether in or outside of the church?

A: If I could sum it up I would say running after things they cant catch; money, its never enough; power, its never enough; lust, its never enough, and so on. If they would just run after God the bible says He is more than enough. Don't let me start preaching, LOL.

Q: Without too much detail or violating the confidentiality of the group, can you possibly give me 1 or 2 examples of the miracles and transformations to which you made reference?

A: First, there was a brother who came to the group around 2 years ago. He committed adultery multiple time and his wife asked him to leave and he did. It was a very UGLY situation, but with the MIGHTY hand of God there marriage was restored and they have both recommitted their lives to Jesus and they are both going to church. His wife gets involved in the woman's ministry, and he is involved with all the men's ministry gatherings — PRAISE THE LORD!!! Second, there was a brother who was sort of playing games with God. You know, walking with Him and then not walking with Him. And I guess his marriage was getting hit hard from the enemy (his wife is not a believer) so she actually had committed adultery and he left the house to keep peace because he has a very young daughter. That brother is still going through a major trial and his wife is with the other person and it does not seem like she wants to reconcile the marriage. This brother has grown IMMENSELY in Christ. He is actually studding to get his credentials with the Assemblies of God. He is one of the men's leaders and is on FIRE for the Lord.

Q: In a couple of sentences please summarize your testimony, and tell us what lessons you would like men to learn from it.

A: I came from the streets of Newark, NJ and from living a life of crime most of my life, to having a life of businesses and financial success. I thought that was living and good planning. Now I am still a business man but most of all I am a Godly man. I went from NO PLAN (just allowing what ever happens, happen) to MY PLAN (starting to work hard in order to get ahead) to GODS PLAN! Now I am living in the TRUE POTENTIAL for my life. SO MEN SEEK OUT GOD'S PLAN BECAUSE ITS THE PERFECT ONE. Amen!

Q: How can we summarize your message to men?

A: Stop trusting in yourself and start trusting in God. Men you will only get so far in life, no matter what the areas such as Relationship, Work, Ministry, or whatever else. You will only reach the human limits following your own plans. They are not God's best. Only with God can all those areas flourish to where the sky is the limit!



Q: To what do you attribute the success and longevity of the Men's Fellowship?

A: THREE THINGS: (1) PRAYER; (2) MORE PRAYER; (3) and EVEN MORE PRAYER. We don't plan anything special we just prayer about it and meet together and be open to what God wants and He does the rest Amen.

These men have truly honored the Lord in all that they do in their meetings, and as a result, God has shown them His faithfulness in allowing them to consistently meet for 10 yrs, and maintain a great level of accountability and confidentiality.

Rev. John Orlando and the Men's Fellowship meet on the 3rd Friday of every month. Other Men's Groups meet on the 4th Friday of Every month with Brother Karl Moers, and on the 1st Friday of each month with Brother Mike Scibettas. PRAISE REPORT

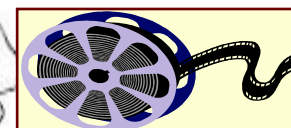
"HE KNOWS WHAT YOU NEED BEFORE YOU ASK!"

Fatherhood isn't for the fainthearted. It's a calling every bit as demanding—maybe even *more* so—as being a, say, fireman or policeman. That's the life lesson Adam Mitchell, a deputy sheriff; officer Shane Fuller, Atlanta cop Nathan Hayes, Rookie David Thomson and Javier Martinez learn in *Courageous*.

Mitchell provides for his family, but feels too dignified to run a 5k father-son race with his own son; and to dance with his daughter in public. Fuller is a divorced father struggling to make alimony payments for two sons. Hayes has just moved back to Albany to raise his three children with wife Kayla—a job he's determined to do better than his deadbeat dad did. Thomson *looks* like a carefree bachelor, but we soon learn that he's hiding his fatherhood. And Javier Martinez, the only man in this group who's not on the force, is fighting like mad to keep from losing his home. A home that currently shelters his wife and two young'uns. Many fathers will identify with these men.

By day these men either pursue Albany's drug dealers (or gainful employment). By night they manage the mundane affairs of their households. On weekends, they congregate around a backyard grill to mull their everyman conundrums until, that is, tragedy strikes Adam, opportunity finds Javier, conviction changes David and temptation tugs at Shane. It's time for God's love and principles to win the day and make a few good fathers *great* fathers.
